

LUNCH/TUITION BILLS

Please remember that if you are on the monthly payment plan for tuition, your final payment is actually due June 1. If you would like to include that with your May payment or pay before students leave for the summer that would be fine.

Final lunch bills will be going home May 14 and will project your child's breakfast and lunch orders for the remainder of the school year. These bills will need to be paid in full by May 21. If returning students have a credit balance at that time it will be carried over into the next school year.

Grade cards will be mailed home when all financial obligations are met in full. Also, records cannot be transferred to other schools until all payments are received. There are still several families that are significantly behind in tuition and lunch payments. Please keep in mind that we cannot effectively operate the school when we do not have these necessary funds coming in.

One final note: As Linda and I looked at the lunch bills today it occurred to us that some of your bills seemed higher than usual. I want to assure you that we did check them and determined that April had the most "in-school days" as well as the fact that we sent bills early last month so this bill actually includes several days from March as well.
